Who doesn\t know ROWDY? Who doesn\t remember having been passed by ROWDY? Who didn\t one day watch ROWDY with a lot of curiosity, admiration and even envy for her beautiful flowing lines? Fine tuned by her current owner ROWDY's authenticity is impressive and her condition hard to fault. Under his aegis this yacht has indeed dominated her class at classic regattas making her probably the most successful classic race winner on the Mediterranean Circuit ever. Never forget however her versatility and capacity for cruising - a true all rounder. If the New York Yacht Club's intention in 1916 was for a yacht that could cruise comfortably with a small crew – with racing almost a secondary consideration, Herreshoff's genius nevertheless created a yacht so tough and seaworthy the class was to win two Bermuda Races in short order – enough to earn the Class soubriquet "The Fighting Forties". A classic piece of Americana - and coming up to her centenary ROWDY is one of only five remaining examples of this stunning class; one of very few as capable from any era.

HISTORY

The Class born just one year before the United States entered WW I, the first twelve including ROWDY raced hard before such sailing was temporarily curtailed. They were to be joined later by two more; RUGOSA and MARILEE of the yacht having been restored and determined to see her. "Blown away" and judging by how cruising racing yacht designs were to develop, these were well ahead of their time.

Her former owner Holland Duell, lawyer, distinguished WWI veteran, and New York State Senator, was to race ROWDY extensively in Long Island Sound – with many wins in the 1920s - to the end of his sailing career. Subsequently owned by a series of other lawyers, she was domiciled on the Great Lakes before moving far west to California in houseboat mode, subsequently to be rescued by Chris Madsen and restored.

Come the 2000 Millenium, while in California Graham Walker had learned of the yacht having been restored and determined to see her. "Blown away" by her scale and beauty, he was to buy her and notwithstanding the work already done, rendered her race fit with a Marconi rig more in line with Herreshoff's own later design of 1927. These and other changes equipped her well for her notable second racing career. Rowdy is the only of the original NYYC 40s never to have her name changed. The boat is extremely well documented by the New York Times, New York Yacht Club, Larchmont Yacht Club, Herreshoff, MIT, Mystic Seaport, and Rosenfeld Collection.
